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Q: So... what is a distro?

A distro, or, distribution is a collection of Drupal core and a group of specific modules that aim to be a self-contained solution for a particular use case or industry segment.

Q: Why use a distro?

Upon inspection, you feel it is "as close to" a perfect fit as possible for your website needs.









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Q: Why doesn't everyone use a distro?

While distros can fit the needs of some websites, they are meant to be an "out of the box" solution. Changing functionality can have adverse results.

Q: What if a distro has more negatives than positives?

1: identify. 2: evaluate. 3: create. 4: share.







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Size up your challenge and get psyched!:

- Do we really need all the complexity, size and overhead
- Can it be done with a much more streamlined approach
- Should we just "accept" known problem areas
- Can a beginning developer continue to improve, update and extend









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They gave me a challenge.. This was my plan.. we rocked it

- Tiny footprint relational data model (15 back end modules or less)
- No time consuming configurations
- Multi-Event management with custom UI's for all
- Spin up a site in a few days, not weeks or months
- Smaller than the average cell phone app
- Simple to expand
- Lightning fast performance









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1: Identify:

Identify and understand explicit functionality for minimum viable launch.

2: Evaluate:

Elegant and simple solutions allow for longevity and are upgrade friendly. Have a plan for everything. Know your specifics. Ie; users, attendees, payment, scheduling, venues etc.







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3: Create:

Explicit documentation before Drupal. Then build from documentation.

4: Share:

Tell everyone! Encourage downloads. Present at user groups.







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Minimum viable launch inventory:

- Mandatory content types.
- Identify data relationships
- Create IA (fields)
- Gather module inventory

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Documentation:

Document explicitly in a spreadsheet.

Yes, a site builder CAN and SHOULD be a data architect... always!

Build from documentation.
